Exciting learning is happening with Bethany staff engaging in PLCs working on the:


- new Science and Technology Syllabus K-6

Mission: Sock It To Poverty

Term 4 sees each grade at Bethany beginning their learning in Religious Education with a 3-4 week unit about Mission. The following are the units for each grade:

Kindergarten	Mission: Living as Jesus Showed Us
Year One	Mission: Sharing with others as Jesus Showed Us
Year Two	Mission: Loving God and others as Jesus (PBL unit)
Year Three	Mission: Reaching Out with Jesus (PBL unit)
Year Four	Mission: Serving others with Jesus
Year Five	Mission: Witnessing and Proclaiming Jesus Throughout the World
Year Six	Mission: Living and Sharing the Mission of Jesus

Mission can be defined as 'the vocation or calling of a religious organisation, especially a Christian one, to go out into the world and spread its faith'. One of the main scriptures focused on within the Year 3 Mission unit is 'The Mission of the Twelve'. Just like Jesus' disciples, we are called to mission, to reach out to those in need and answer the call to love God and love our neighbour.

'I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.' John 13:34

Catholic Mission, a charitable organisation, is the international mission agency of the Catholic Church in Australia. Their mission is to 'answer the call to love God and love our neighbour, and work to establish the Reign of God through building communities of missionary disciples of Jesus, who share their faith by proclaiming the Word, serving people in need, acting for justice and creation, and adopting child-focused development programs.

An initiative of Catholic Mission is Socktober. Friday 26th October is '**Sock It To Poverty**' day at Bethany. On this day, the students are encouraged to wear 'crazy' socks to school instead of their regular school socks. Students are asked to bring a gold coin donation on this day. All monies collected on this day will be donated to Catholic Mission. Participation in this initiative helps us to fulfil our obligation to answer the call to love God and love our neighbour.

NAPLAN

The individual student reports provide information about what students know and have achieved in the areas of reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy. They also provide information on how students have performed in relation to other students in the same year group, and against the national average and the national minimum standards.

In Term 4, the NAPLAN data will be analysed by teachers across Bethany and used to inform our Bethany School goal in Literacy, as well as identify areas of need.

PAT-R

This week students in Years 2 - 6 completed a diocesan assessment for comprehension. This assessment comprises questions across a range of difficulties, whilst assessing different areas of comprehension. The data gathered from this assessment will also be used to identify areas of need across the school, contribute to the Bethany Literacy goal, and will be analysed by the classroom teacher, the learning support team and the school leadership team.

Early Years Assessment-EYA

In Weeks 7 and 8 of Term 4, K-2 students will be involved in the Early Years Assessment for Literacy. This test has already been conducted in Term 1 with their classroom teacher. Data is gathered from this assessment and used to identify, as early as possible, students who may need extra support or enrichment. The following is an outline of the focus for each grade:

2019 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Wednesday 31st October as these trials will be held in November 2018.

All OTHER sport registrations will open in November for 2019 trials.

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2019 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term 4 in 2018 and Term 1 and 2 in 2019.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is **strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 and 6 in 2019 be invited to attend.**

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au.

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2019 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria; therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by the child's school**. In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **All fields and especially "Representative Experience" MUST be completed.**

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

Other News

School Fees

Thank you to all those families who have paid their 2018 school fees. Families with accounts that have not yet been paid will receive a Term 4 statement showing the outstanding balance. Prompt payment would be appreciated, as accounts will be referred to CEDP if no contact has been made. This may affect your credit rating in the future.

Summer Uniform

As we start Term 4, all students are now to be wearing full summer uniform and we ask parents to ensure their children are in the correct uniform each day. All school uniform items are available from Lowes, Westfield Penrith. Bethany school hats form part of the school uniform and are therefore a compulsory item. Bethany hats are available to purchase from the school office.

There are a large number of second hand summer uniform items available from our school clothing pool. The clothing pool operates every Tuesday at 2:30pm-2.45pm and enables good second hand uniforms to be sold at very reasonable prices. Many thanks to the parent volunteers who assist in running the clothing pool.

Hair accessories such as ribbons and clips are to be of school colours.

For safety reasons, we ask that children wear minimal jewellery or no jewellery at all. Students may wear a silver or gold chain necklace with a cross or other religious symbol. One pair of studs or sleepers may be worn.

Sickness

Earlier this week a letter was sent out via the Skoolbag app, notifying parents and carers that a number of students in various grades have been sick with gastroenteritis. This is a highly contagious virus and easily spread, particularly in places such as schools.

To reduce the spread of illness to our students and staff, we ask that you keep your child at home if they are unwell. It is particularly important that you remind your child of the importance of washing their hands thoroughly with soap and running water, and covering their mouth when coughing.
