## <u>Positive Behaviour Support for Learning (PBS4L)</u>



Over the past fortnight each grade has focussed on explicitly teaching introductory lessons examining what these expectations look and sound like. Having clear expectations provides consistency across the school and enables teachers to reinforce and acknowledge positive behaviours as well as correcting inappropriate behaviour in a constructive and instructive manner.



## **Opening School Mass**

Our school year commenced last Thursday with a wonderful Opening School Mass celebrated by our Parish Priest Father Suresh Kumar. The students demonstrated a great sense of reverence during the Mass and participated wholeheartedly in every respect – listening attentively, responding, singing and praying. It was an inspiring occasion as we joined together – students, staff, and many parents in communion to pray for the year ahead. During his homily, Father Suresh graciously welcomed our new students, staff and parents, and offered a positive message to the children on the importance of incorporating both study and play into their lives this year.

## School Refurbishment Project

Recently I informed our community of the fantastic news that during this year, our school will be undertaking major refurbishment works to upgrade each of our classroom spaces in order to provide wonderful new facilities to enhance learning for our students.

The project will see the internal refurbishment of all classrooms which will include new joinery, glazed partitions and sliding doors (between classrooms), floor finishes, ceiling and wall finishes and associated improvements to each learning space including new furniture and AV equipment.

The refurbishment project will occur in a planned and incremental grade by grade manner over the next few months. During the holidays building works continued in order to complete the construction of accessibility ramps to the school playing fields and student foyer.



Both these school improvements are now complete and in use. As well as this work the demountable block used for Italian, Music and Counselling is currently undergoing a complete refurbishment including the installation of new floor finishes, ceilings, wall finishes, internal and external painting, ramped verandahs and balustrades and concreting of the external courtyard. This upgrade is due to be completed by the beginning of March. Once work is completed these three classrooms will be used as temporary classrooms whilst refurbishment work takes place in particular grades. The delivery of Italian & Music lessons will take place in your child's classroom until the school refurbishment work is completed. The school counsellor will see students in the administration building. I will continue to keep you updated about the project as more information becomes available.

## **Welcome BBQ**

Last Thursday afternoon we hosted a community BBQ to welcome both new and returning families. It was a relaxed, convivial and really well-attended event. Thank you to all those who volunteered to help in various ways to plan, cook and serve the BBQ. Thank you also to Father Suresh who attended the BBQ to mingle with and greet families of our community.

## The Start of Lent

Yesterday we began the season of Lent by being marked on our foreheads with the ashes burnt from last year's palms during Mass. The season of Lent leading to Holy Week & Easter provides us with a time to deepen our spiritual relationship with God and to translate this into action through fasting (giving up), almsgiving (giving to others) & prayer.

Although ashes give the appearance of being dull and lifeless we know that after a bushfire ashes have the wondrous ability to help new seeds sprout and grow. Ashes also symbolize cleansing. For many years people (including my grandmother) used ash to make cakes of soap to wash themselves. The cross is a sign which reminds us that just as Jesus gave of himself for others we need to share what we have.

During Lent we give thanks for the good things that God has given us and remember that these blessings are not just for us. We must share them and use them to help other people in the world who do not have enough food, clean water and healthcare or love.

One way we can do this is by contributing to the Project Compassion Appeal. Another way is by thinking about the needs of others and doing something practical to help them.

## **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

Although we are only 2 weeks into the 2024 academic year, we have had a very busy start to the school year. Our Bethany community celebrated our Beginning Year School Mass last Thursday. It was a very special celebration where we welcomed our Kindergarten students as well as new teaching staff.



## LENT BEGINS

The liturgical season of Lent began with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Lent is a time where we prepare ourselves for the most significant event in the church calendar: Easter.

By receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday, we were reminded of our own mortality and to repent for our sins. Hundreds of years ago, people used ashes as a symbol of repentance. They were a sign that they had let the 'fire' of goodness go out. Receiving the ashes in the form of a cross on our foreheads reminds us that the season of Lent has begun and this season will end with the Easter season when we mark the crucifixion and triumphant resurrection of Jesus.

## **LEARNING IN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

Each grade has begun their Learning Cycle in Religious Education for Term One. The following is an overview of the Focus Question that each grade will base their learning on in Religious Education:

Kindergarten - How will others know that Jesus is my friend?

## **BETHANY RE ANGELS**

- Following Jesus' example by being **respectful** of the faith beliefs and experiences of others.
- Honesty.
- Prayerful: understand that praying is an important part of daily life at Bethany.
- Reverent: during liturgies, Masses and prayer times.

Students who are interested in becoming an RE Angel will be invited to write an expression of interest explaining how they display the above qualities. All expressions of interest are due NO LATER THAN **Tuesday 20th February.**

Library bags keep books safe, clean and dry on the journey between school and home. Any student borrowing a book to take home, needs to have a library bag.







We now have our new canteen operator up and running.

To ensure the service runs smoothly, here is some extra information that may help.

Please take a few minutes to read through.

Download **SPRIGGY SCHOOLS**. (Munch Monitor no longer works).

#### Parent Account:

Go to settings to add your child profiles.

You are able to upload money to your parent account.

This money can be used for pre-purchasing recess and lunch orders against your child profiles.

### THE CUT OFF FOR RECESS AND LUNCH ORDERS IS 9.00AM SHARP!

#### How do I give my child canteen spending money?

There are 2 ways:

## 1. The SPRIGGY app "SPENDING MONEY"

In the app you are able to purchase "Spending Money". This will allow your child to go and choose items from the canteen and pay from their spending money credit.

- This spending money will NOT be able to be used on hot food items.
- The spending money does NOT have to be spent in one go.
- The spending money does NOT expire.
- Your child is only able to access "Spending Money" credit. They cannot access the funds in the parent wallet.

## 2. CASH

The canteen DOES accept cash.

(The school office does NOT accept cash).

#### How does my child collect their pre-paid order?

Recess - your child should go to the canteen to collect their pre ordered recess.

Lunch - Will be delivered to the class.
