DEFINITION OF BULLYING

Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/ or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records).

Bullying of any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those

involved, including bystanders.

Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying.

NAPLAN Update

We wish to inform all Year 3 and 5 parents that the students will be sitting for NAPLAN practice tests in Week 9. It is one 45-minute omnibus test for both Years 3 & 5 and a writing test for the Year 5 students. The purpose of the tests is to allow students access to the online assessment platform via the locked down browser so they can experience its functionality and online tools. Whilst students do not need to be computer experts to sit the Online test, this is a key step in getting our students ready for NAPLAN Online.

The NAPLAN Online tests will be taking place in the following specific order. The NAPLAN Online assessment window starts on Tuesday 14 May and finishes on Friday 24 May 2019. Individual students are not permitted to sit the online tests after Friday 24 May 2019.

Isaiah 58:6-9


- 6 "Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen:

Best of luck to them both.




SWIMMING

PBS4L Lessons update!

How can we as students at Bethany, demonstrate that we are safe, respectful learners who follow Jesus in all settings?

All Settings Lesson Plans

In Christ We Love and serve

At Bethany we follow our three school rules

We are Safe

We are Respectful

We are learners



Every week, students will be engaged in a series of lessons which will focus on our three overarching school rules - *I am Safe, I am Respectful and I am a Learner.*



Our first lesson was based around our Focus of the Week - We use active listening and follow instructions

Learning Intention: We are learning to be respectful in all school settings. **Success Criteria:**

I can:

- explain what active listening is
- show active listening in all settings
- compare and contrast appropriate and inappropriate active listening



PBS4L

At Bethany it is important that we listen and follow instructions as it shows respect to the person speaking.

At Bethany, active listening is:

- acknowledging the person who is speaking with full attention and eye contact
- affirming through body language that the speaker is being heard
- listening with eyes and ears

Students were both engaged and entertained when they viewed a short clip of the teachers, teaching them about the importance of active listening and how this shows respect to the person speaking!

The first clip showed the very opposite of active listening. It was disruptive and disrespectful. No eye contact, talking over the teacher or while the teacher was talking, not following instructions.





The next clip showed how to be active listeners using the 5 L's;

- Look with your eyes
- Listen with your ears
- Lips are closed
- Laps are where your hands are
- Legs are crossed

We are looking forward to developing our next short clip, showing how to care for and respect each other! The students may get to see some different faces in the next lesson!

EVACUATION PLANS AND PROCEDURES

It is a legal requirement that all workplaces have an emergency plan. Preparing a school for an emergency is an essential element of Work, Health and Safety (WHS).

No one can predict when an emergency is going to take place. Emergency situations may arise due to a fire, explosion, medical emergency, natural disaster, bomb threat or violence. Plans will help staff and visitors in any type of emergency.

By the end of the term and every term after, the staff and students will undertake evacuation drills to prepare them if an emergency ever arises. Emergency drills should be undertaken a minimum of once per term and staff must be trained. At Bethany, there will be one announced and one unannounced drill every term. The teachers have reviewed the 2019 Evacuation procedure and an announced drill is scheduled for Friday of next week. After the drill, there will be a feedback session to discuss if any amendments need to occur.
