Parent-Teacher Interviews Term 2, Week 10

It is that time of the year where, assessments are collated, professional discussions are had among grade teams and reports are being written for Semester 1. In the coming weeks parents will receive communication regarding the end of term Parent-Teacher Interviews. Our interview week will be as per previous years, Week 10 Term 2. Over the course of that week, parents and carers will have the opportunity to meet with their child's classroom teacher to discuss the report, their progress and set some goals for the remainder of the year. Parents are encouraged to attend these interviews. Teacher availabilities will be sent home and online bookings can take place after that. On Wednesday of Week 10, June 4th, the Parent-Teacher interviews will be until 8pm. This will provide parents some time-slots after the 5pm usual finish. We look forward to the open dialogue between parents and teachers.

Parent/School Communication:

Good communication between home and school is pivotal to our working relationship. It is in working together that we can ensure quality teaching and learning experiences for all students. Teachers, leadership, and namely the Assistant Principal and Principal work as instructional leaders in the context of our school. This means that as much time as possible is spent in the classroom working collaboratively with colleagues to improve practice, implement new pedagogies and ensure success for every learner.

Every child is important and we understand that on occasions parents and carers may need to communicate new information, whether it be a concern or some good news, to us. RE - Mrs Cignarella



On Monday members of the Bethany Leadership team pre sented at the Term 2 Cluster Action Plan meeting at Cor pus Christi Primary School, Cranebrook. Mrs Biordi pre sented the Religious Education data on my behalf while I was away at Year 6 Camp. Other schools present were representatives from Mary MacKillop Primary School, South Penrith and St. Joseph's Primary School in Kingswood.

Mrs Biordi presented data and work samples from Term 1 in relation to the Religious Literacy Assessment (RLA) task that all students from Kindergarten to Year 6 undertook for the Lenten units. This was an opportunity to showcase the wonderful work being done in Religious Education at Bethany, as well as to receive valuable feedback on ways

to further improve the teachers' and students' learnings for the remainder of the year, in relation to our RE goal.

Present for the day to also offer feedback to all schools in relation to Religious Education were Mr Gavin Hayes, Bethany's CEDP Learning Leader and Amanda Bentley, our CEDP Mission Leader of Learning. Both Gavin and Amanda commended Bethany for the quality level of data collection and analysis across the school from Kindergarten to Year 6. They were also impressed how the School's recent staff development day addressed aspects of the school goal: For all students to increase their existing knowledge of the Spiritual Sense using sacred scriptures with a focus on Sacraments and Jesus.

The Action Plan meetings include an opportunity for all the Leaders to undertake an instructional walk around the hosting school's classes to see 'evidence' in action, and again to offer the school valuable feedback and feedforward on ways to improve classroom practice. The leaders of each school present had the opportunity to ask the students across the grades the 5 Learning Questions: What are you learning? How are you doing it? How do you know? How can you improve? Where do you go for help? These are the same learning questions we use at Bethany to ensure students are engaging in deep learning.

The baseline data used for developing our 2018 Religious Education school goal indicated that we were performing above the Dioceses in all Key Concepts, however, the key concepts of Sacraments and Jesus were areas we decided we would like to develop further at Bethany. We presented the whole school's pre and post test data for the Lenten units. The data showed there was significant growth from pre-testing to post-testing. This indicates that our visible learning approach of utilising Learning Intentions and Success Criteria, and feedback and feedforward in Religious Education has resulted in significant growth for most students.

RE Continued-Mrs Cignarella

At present, the teachers are finalising the assessment tasks, rubrics and teaching and learning pathways for their students' next RLA, which will begin with a pre-test of three key questions for all grades next week.

Your child will be formally assessed with the post test some time in week 10. The data from these units will provide me and my RE Professional Learning Community of teachers at Bethany with valuable information in relation to our school goal.

How can I help my child with their next RLA unit?

- Talk to them about the sacraments
- Discuss how Jesus is a part of our everyday lives through prayer
- Talk about the main scripture from your child's unit of work (ask your child which Scripture they are learning)
- Identify the main message from that scripture and how they can relate that to their own lives.

I am looking forward to working with the teachers and students in developing a greater articulation of the Catholic faith with a particular focus on Sacraments and Jesus.

NUMERACY- Mrs Donlan

On Monday of this week I had the pleasure of attending what is known as the 'Cluster Action Plan' meeting. This meeting brings together four schools in the area: St Mary of the Cross MacKillop South Penrith, Corpus Christi Cranebrook, St Joseph's Kingswood and of course Bethany.

This meeting is an opportunity for each of the schools to present their 2018 goals in regard to Religious Education, Literacy and Numeracy and how each of the schools are implementing practices to achieve the goals.

When speaking to the numeracy leaders of other schools I managed to share much of the professional learning that staff at Bethany have been undertaking in regards to 'working mathematically' and problem-solving. We spent some time analysing student 'problem of the week' samples and ways that we at Bethany can track student progress in this area. Baseline work samples were collected in Week 9 of Term 1 and this week sees the next formal collection of these samples for comparison. Once this data is finalised I intend on sharing it with the Bethany community.

Positive feedback that I received on the day included:

- Excellent choice of goal based on the various forms of data collected in 2017
- Thoroughly planned professional learning experiences for staff to build their capacity in assisting students in achieving the goal
- Evidence of teaching programs that include working mathematically in the success criteria
- 'Problem of the Week' being implemented across the school that teachers teach to and then assess in Weeks 5 and 9
- Students being able to self and peer assess themselves using the 3 point rubric
- Greater accuracy when reporting to parents on this strand of mathematics

We are on a wonderful, exciting journey here at Bethany and are pleased that all of this hard work is paying off for teachers and students alike.
