All Bethany staff have been proactive in being on duty every morning and afternoon this week to assist our families and students in the transition to the new procedures. Thank you to all the parents and carers who are following staff directions.

As we continue the new procedures into Week 8, the staff wish to express our appreciation of all students, parents and carers for your patience and support. Thank you for the positive feedback and feed forward we have received. Please be advised that there will be a survey to complete at the end of the term.

The Year 5 & 6 students and teachers were very excited this week when they were visited by Mr Tim Hardy, Team Leader, System Learning and two educators from Advanced Reasoning in Education (ARIE), Think Global Project Based Learning (PBL) Academy from Texas. The ARIE staff and CEDP learning leader engaged in an Instructional Walk with the school leadership team.

The following questions were asked of the students and teachers during the instructional walk:

- What was the entry event of this project?
- What is the driving questions for this project?
- What is the end product for this project?
- Can you show me the rubric for this project?
- What processes do you use to help manage group issues?
- Where can you go for help?
- What are the different types of assessments in this project?



It was a fantastic experience for all as the team provided feedback regarding the insights gained from the instructional walks. The Year 6 teachers attended further professional development this week with the Project Based Learning frameworks. The Year 4 teachers will be attending the same professional learning in August this year.

Please ensure you read the whole newsletter as there is clarifying information regarding the arrival and dismissal, as well as the details for dismissal when there are wet weather conditions.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Bethany wishes to support the parents and carers by publishing frequently asked questions (FAQ) with responses, with the aim to provide ongoing communication. There is a trial period of 4 weeks, at the end of which parents will be given the opportunity to provide feedback via a google survey.

Why the decision to change Arrival and Dismissal Procedures?

As mentioned in previous communication the Arrival and Dismissal policy has been developed in order to fulfil our moral imperative and legal requirement to take all appropriate actions to ensure the safety of all students, staff and community members. School supervision plans need to address the safe arrival and departure of students at and from the school. It is the school's responsibility to ensure that all policies and procedures are regularly reviewed. A forum was opened to all parents and anyone who wished was invited to form part of the A & D Committee. School staff were also invited to be part of the committee. The invitation was included in the Week 6 Term 4, 2017 Newsletter. During this term the committee members provided recommendations and solutions to assist in formulating the A & D procedures. We ask the parent community to trust in the school's discernment in actioning a new procedure for Arrival and Dismissal, and look forward to your feedback via a google survey in Week 11 this term.

Parent/carer cooperation with **arrival and dismissal** procedures supports your child's safety and **is** appreciated.

Where is Gate 4?

- Gate 1: William Howell Dr (Parents and students who walk home and to the carpark, students who catch a bus)
- Gate 2: Not opened in the afternoon.
- Gate 3: Caroline Chisholm (students with pass, and/or Bethany Parent Arrangement)
- Gate 4: Opens at 2:50pm for student dismissal for Park & Collect. (Double gate between 4B and 1B classrooms, leads to Parish car park. Please see Dismissal Map)

Where will the children sit before 8:00am?

All children will enter through the school gate on William Howell Drive and walk up the steps and gather near the School Office block. Benches are accessible for students to sit waiting for Gate 1 to be opened at 8:00 am when teacher supervision begins. The teacher on duty will open the gate at 8:00 am and walk the students down to the *student only zones (SOZ)* playground areas (NB passive play only in mornings).

Where is the Parent's Designated Area?

The **Parent Designated Area** is the **astro turf area** between the back of Year 1 and the Hall/ Canteen. The purpose of the area is for parents/carers to gather, be able to mix with other parents and be available to settle their children into a day of school and learning.

Why are the school gates opened at 8:00 am?

The school gates are opened at 8:00 am because that is when school supervision begins in the school day. Parents are not expected to drop their child off before 8.00 am because there is no teacher supervision. The school's active supervision hours are 8.00 - 3.15 pm. Naturally, there would be a discretionary time allowance for children who arrive at Gate 1, say 7:50 am to 8.00 am, where they can sit quietly and wait for approximately 10 minutes before the gate opens. However, parents who drop their child at the school Gate 1 before 7.50 am are advised to make one of the following arrangements:

- reconsider their arrival time and come later
- wait with child/ren outside Gate 1 until gates open and students are met by teachers
- book their child into Out of Hours School Care before school starts
- contact the Principal regarding personal circumstances.

Can the students see the Parent Designated Area from the Basketball Courts?

The 'Parent Designated Area' is purposefully adjacent to the basketball courts so parents and students can see each other. During dismissal in the afternoon, when a child sees their parent/ carer they will 'High 5' their teacher and leave with their parent/carer, being dismissed for the afternoon. Students will be supervised by teachers under the basketball court area at all times during the dismissal process. This area is under review but will remain the same for now until the end of the 4 week trial.

Can Kinder and Year 1 parents wait and watch their children put their bag down?

We ask all parents to move to the Parent Designated Area to wait while their child walks to their classroom to put their bag down and then the children return to meet up with their parent and/or join their friends in the play areas. Parents entering from Gate 1 can direct their child to go to the Kindergarten/Year 1 area to put their bag down, but parents are asked to continue to walk to the Parent Designated Area. Staff would appreciate the parents following these directions so there is a clearway for all members of the school community.

Can a ramp be installed near the steps leading to Gate 2 for pedestrians with prams?

On Monday, day 1 of the new procedures the need for a ramp was identified by parents with prams. The school will follow up this need and organise quotes to construct a ramp and the installation for a handrail on the steps.

Last newsletter I gave an example of a multi-step problem. This week I have included the rubric we have developed for primary students (Years 3 to 6) and teachers to use in relation to 'Problem of the Week'.

You will notice that there is a clear progression of skills related to problem-solving. This rubric has been created based on the outcomes outlined in the NSW K-10 Mathematics Syllabus.

Another new practice this year is the use of the 'thumbs up' signal for when a student has got it, to the side when they are getting there and 'thumbs down' when they are not yet there. This is already proving a great tool students are using to self and peer assess their work against the rubric. For example when they hear an explanation from a peer during reflection they give them the 'thumb' signal by referring to anchor chart examples around the room.

Next week I plan to share a student 'Problem of the Week' work sample that has been marked according to the working mathematically rubric.

ALERT-WET WEATHER PROCEDURE

During wet weather conditions the dismissal procedure will change. Please read the following dismissal procedure that will occur in the event of wet weather. Please note you will be notified via Skoolbag with "**Wet Weather Dismissal Procedure Today**" when this is put into place for that day. The SKoolbag app is an important tool on such days and we recommend that all parents, grandparents, child's carer etc have access to the app.

Wet Weather Dismissal Procedure:-

Car pick up (Children who get picked up by car on William Howell Drive) - Please pick up your child from the school car park at **Park and Collect** between Kindergarten and Year 1.

Bus students - will catch the bus as normal. Students catching the bus from Caroline Chisholm will leave on the first bell.

Walkers - Will be walked outside the school gate to walk home as normal.

Gates will be open at 2:30pm for parents to collect their child/ren from their classroom, if your usual arrangement is to pick them up from school. Parents are required to sign their children out from the classroom.

Caroline Chisholm students will proceed from the basketball court where they will meet Miss Gutierrez who will open gate 3 at 2:40pm.

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5 When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4 Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".

8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch. Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.
