Reflection - What does God want from us? The greatest commandment Mk 12:28–34

One of the scribes who had listened to them debating appreciated that Jesus had given a good answer and put a further question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one, only Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.'



The above scripture from the Gospel of Mark is one of my favourite scriptures. In this scripture,

Jesus teaches that the Ten Commandments consist of two great commandments: to love God and to love one another.

Jesus, what is the greatest command?

To love God with all your being.

What does it mean to love God with all my being?

Love your neighbour as yourself.

But what does it mean to love my neighbor?Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

Instead of just saying all of His commandments are equally important, Jesus answers the scribe by first emphasising that God is God alone and without equal. Therefore, we should love and serve God with all of our being. Jesus shows that we are called to direct our whole lives to God, which includes our actions and choices. As a result, we should view the rest of Jesus' teachings as helping us to love and come closer to God. Jesus then points out that we are to love our neighbour as ourselves. We are called to show God's unceasing love for all people, which enables us to more fully see God's presence in the world.

While it may seem these commandments are too basic or simple, think about the numerous times where we have found it difficult to follow these teachings. So many things in our lives try to pull our focus away from serving God and others: greed, wealth, pride, grades, and even fear. We must continually remind ourselves of the importance of these commandments.

We are reminded over and over again that LOVE - love of God and love of neighbour - is our ultimate goal.

To love God with all your heart is a daily challenge: remembering God, not only when in trouble, but every day. Prayer – of whatever kind – helps to keep God in the forefront of our mind.

But we're on holidays, why do I have to read?

Just because children have a break from formal lessons at school, doesn't mean that they should have a break from reading. The holiday break is a perfect opportunity for children to immerse themselves in literature and to continue to develop their comprehension skills. Here are some suggestions for how to to engage your child in quality reading during the holiday break:

- Go to the local library and spend some time browsing through the many shelves of books. Spend some time sitting together and reading some of the books. Take turns to read a page each. Find books by the same author and/or illustrator.
- For younger children, ask them to identify familiar sight words within the books.
- For older children, read materials other than books such as magazines and newspapers. Ask:
 What is the main idea of the story? Who is the target audience? What is the purpose of the articles in the magazines or newspapers?
- Read labels when you are out shopping. Ask your child to interpret the food labels and nutritional tables.
- Follow a recipe or a set of instructions to construct something or play a new game.
- Visit a gallery and make the most of visual literacy opportunities. Interpret images in artworks.
 Ask: What is the main idea? Who is the target audience? What is the purpose of the image/artwork?
- Sit with your child to use digital technologies as reading material. Listen to stories online.
- Play Scrabble or other word games.
- Background knowledge and personal experiences play a huge role in comprehension. Go on some excursions such as the beach, the city, the country, a museum, catch a train or a bus, watch the planes at an airport or air-base, visit a farm or zoo, go bushwalking, go fishing, visit a lookout. The list is endless.
- Ask questions about what your child is reading. Probe deeper beyond the obvious to prompt critical thinking about the text. You never know where the discussion could lead.

NUMERACY- Mrs Donlan



The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. All students are expected to participate in tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Year 3 and 5 students at Bethany will be sitting the numeracy test on Thursday 17th May in the morning session. The test is just one aspect of our school's assessment and reporting process, and does not replace the extensive, ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance.

The NAPLAN numeracy tests measure the achievement of students in numeracy. The numeracy test assesses the strands of understanding, fluency, problem-solving and reasoning across the three content strands of mathematics: number and algebra; measurement and geometry; and statistics and probability.

The numberacy test contains two types of questions: multiple-choice and written responses.


The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to reassure them that the test is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day.
