On Thursday 25th October, Mrs Brown and I had the privilege of taking some of our Year 6 SRC representatives to the Annual Education Mass, celebrated by Bishop Vincent, at St Patrick's Cathedral. This mass was formerly known as the Mission Mass. The theme for the mass was Mission. At the conclusion of mass, we had the opportunity to look at presentations from other primary and secondary schools in our diocese that showcased the work being done by them to promote mission. We came back to Bethany inspired to continue our mission to reach out to others in need.

The representatives from our Year 6 SRC who attended the Annual Education Mass have reflected on their experiences:

I had experienced an extraordinary thing in my life last week. As an SRC, I was given an amazing opportunity to explore St Patrick's cathedral. I loved this adventure because this cathedral was not like other cathedrals, this one was very modern. I had found out that many years ago half of this place went down in flames, but the other half is still standing.

Mrs Brown, Mrs Baldacchino, Tara, Karlo, Tristan and I first entered the old half that was not burnt down. The first thing that I saw was a cross. It had water flowing down and going into a little pool in the church. This was the baptism area. Then I saw a tabernacle with rows and rows of empty chairs. Mrs Brown realised we were late so we quickly found a seat and listened to Bishop Vincent tell the Gospel. After he told the homily some little kids were saying the prayers of the faithful. Then we received the Eucharist and were told to spread the Word of God. After the mass, we went back to the old part and got to see and touch a big steel statue of St Mary Mackillop. Then after exploring the old part we went back to the new part. We first saw a big shiny crown of thorns hung on the ceiling over the altar and beside it was rows and rows of seats. Behind the altar was Bishop Vincent's chair and behind that was a big cross with Jesus on it. We then stepped outside to receive some refreshments and got to put on virtual reality goggles. We saw some tables which were campaigning schools like Caroline Chisholm. It was an amazing opportunity for me to experience another cathedral/parish and I hope to experience it again.

NUMERACY - Mrs Donlan


Yesterday close to one hundred of our Kinder 2019 parents attended a workshop that outlined the teaching and learning of numeracy here at Bethany.

We began with parents engaging in an ice-breaker where they were given the opportunity to discuss what their experience of maths was like when they were at school.

Information was provided on the importance of Bethany students having a 'Growth Mindset'. Videos of students sharing their experiences with maths learning were viewed. Parents were very impressed with how well the students articulated themselves and how making mistakes is all part of the learning.




The workshop provided information on the NSW Mathematics syllabus, FOCUS 160, and our Bethany



Agreed Practice. The elements of the daily 60 minute numeracy block were covered with particular attention being paid to the open/rich tasks and reflection parts of a lesson.


Parents engaged in a warm-up task where

'probing' questions were asked that required some 'hard thinking'. Just getting an answer correct doesn't cut it anymore. Here at Bethany students are required to explain what they



have done, why they have done that and even how could they do it a more efficient way.

Take home packs provided families with equipment and resources they can use in preparing their children for school as well as homework tasks down the track.



All in all, the workshop was a great success in

informing our 2019 parents about our approach to the teaching and learning of mathematics.
