PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Bethany Parents and Carers,

Parents play an important role in their child's learning and development. Your child is watching you! Be a partner in the learning that happens every day! Your child is learning to expand their vocabulary when you talk with them about their day.

Your child is learning language and literacy when you provide a print-rich environment and a variety of writing tools to explore the written world.

Your child is learning to be confident when you give them plenty of opportunities to experience many different environments and discover new things.

Your child is learning mathematics when you plan meals, cook and bake together or play board games using dice or spinners.

The education of each student in a Catholic school is viewed as a partnership between parents as the first educators of their child and the school. Catholic schools are called to assist parents in fulfilling their obligation for the Christian formation and education of their children.

As a parent, how do you model and teach respect to your child?

Respect is one of the most important virtues a child can have. Teaching your child how to respect others will ensure they develop positive relationships with their family, friends and teachers throughout their life.

Modelling Respect

Modelling respectful behaviour and instilling values that promote empathy, equality, the acceptance of differences and the value of diversity are important.

Respecting Others

Children who learn to respect others are well placed to do the same when they attend school, develop friendships and establish romantic relationships. Parents and carers play a crucial role through modelling behaviour and providing advice and boundaries. A solid foundation in moral and ethical behaviour will help them to develop and maintain respectful connections with others throughout their lives.

USE OF SMART WATCHES, FITNESS TRACKERS (FITBIT) & MOBILE PHONES

Earlier this year communication was shared with the school community regarding the use of electronic wrist devices which serve as more than a time-telling tool, fitness trackers, smart watches etc. It has been noted that students across Years K-6 have access to these tools.

These expensive devices have proven to be a distraction for some students. As teachers and parents alike, we have a responsibility to ensure the safety and eSafety of all members of the school community. Students too have a responsibility to look after these items responsibly. As such, please be advised that if your child is caught using their Smart Watches, FitBit and other similar wrist devices inappropriately or at the inappropriate time, their device will be sent home and the student will not be permitted to return it to school. Students are encouraged to use their gadgets responsibly. Wrist devices such as Garmins which work solely as fitness trackers and time telling tools are permitted.



PBS4L - Positive Behaviour Support for Learning UPDATE

It is important to understand that PBS4L is for EVERYONE! It is not just for kids with challenging behaviours.

Implementing PBS4L at the school means that:

- the expectations of behaviour are made very clear to all in the community
- these expectations are actively taught
- these expectations are positively reinforced by staff when these behaviours are observed
- these expectations are corrected and re-taught by staff when problem behaviour arises.

Why is the teaching of social behaviour skills so important?

We can't take the leap that because expectations are posted in classrooms and around the school environment that students fully understand what is meant by them. Perhaps rules have been discussed with the students on the first day of school and they seem to understand what is being explained to them. Could the students successfully demonstrate each of the rules? How would you know?

The teaching of behaviour must be approached the same way a teacher approaches the teaching of academics. Taking the time to thoroughly teach the expectations will make such a positive difference because students will clearly understand and demonstrate what is expected of them in their classroom and on the playground.

Parent feedback is vital in providing useful insights for any school.


