Compass Reports & Bethany Learning Conferences

In previous years our Student Progress Reports have been created in a platform known as FACES. In light of system changes at CEDP and the closure of the FACES platform, schools throughout the Diocese of Parramatta are moving to Compass Reporting.

Compass is the current school system for our enrolments. This semester's Student Progress Reports will be created via Compass.

What does this mean for me?

- The appearance of the report will look different to its previous format.
- The Year 1-6 Reports will no longer consist of an A-E scale but will maintain a 5 point scale.
- The new Student Progress reports for students in Years 1 6 will have the following wording for **GRADES**:

- High Achievement
- Sound Achievement
- Basic Achievement
- Experiencing difficulty
- The new Student Progress reports for students in Years 1 6 will have the following wording for **EFFORT**:

In last Sunday's Gospel we hear about Jesus calming a storm.

me and say "why are you afraid? I am here with you."

Mark 4:35-41

On that day, when evening had come, Jesus said to the disciples, "Let us go across to the other side." And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

Jesus invites us to trust, and he shows us we can do so with confidence. He is with us throughout the storms of our lives, and is able with a word to bring a great calm. But he understands our fears, and allows us to express them to him, like the disciples who cried out "do you not care?" In the storms of my own life, I too can cry out "Lord, do you not care?". He will hear me, reassure

This Gospel story highlights the stormy journey our faith has to make today. How easily our sense of Jesus' love and presence is drowned out by a multiplicity of voices. As a result, this lessening or loss of faith gives way to fear. At such times he may be asleep in the boat but his love never leaves us.

'Fear knocked on the door but when Faith opened it there was nobody there.'

Mark's Gospel challenges the disciples to grow into a more mature faith. Pitched and tossed on the raging sea, they fear shipwreck. In desperation, they wake Jesus up. He had been asleep. But they had been asleep also! They had been asleep as to who he really is.



Student Supervision

With the winter weather well and truly settled in, we wish to remind parents and carers that the **formal supervision** of students by staff on the school site **commences at 8 am each day**

(30 minutes prior to classes commencing at 8:30am).

Please keep in mind that students arriving prior to 8:30am are **not** supervised. Any students arriving at school before 8am are to **remain seated** in front of the office. For safety reasons they are **not to** engage in running or ball games.

The school has a before and after school care facility onsite that may assist families in this regard.

We thank you for your support and understanding with this matter.

Attendance

CEDP promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education.

If your child is sick or absent you are required to notify the school on the first day of absence if at all possible. All explanations to the school must be provided within **7 days** from the first day of any period of absence.

Absences can be explained using one of the following methods:

- 1. Online: log the absence directly using the one-time link that is sent to you via SMS if your child is absent
- 2. Email the school at bethany@parra.catholic.edu.au
- 3. Telephone the school office on 4723 3700
- 4. Note sent with your child

Where an explanation has not been received within the 7 day timeframe or the explanation has not been accepted, the school will record the absence as unexplained or unjustified on the student's

record. The school will not be able to accept explanations which are not received within the 7 day timeframe. With the Automated SMS message system in place at Bethany, Unexplained Absence letters are no longer be sent to parents.
