Dear Bethany Families,

Last Sunday we celebrated the great feast of **Pentecost** marking the coming of the **Holy Spirit** into the world and the beginning of the Universal Church.

On Wednesday we came together as a school community to celebrate this feast with a special school liturgy and picnic attended by many families. It provided an opportunity to thank God for His gift of Spirit in our lives, the same Spirit that filled the disciples as they huddled, scared and lost in the upper room more than 2000 years ago.



As Sunday's scripture proclaims loud and clear – <u>the coming of the Holy Spirit changed everything.</u> It filled the disciples with spiritual gifts that transformed them from directionless individuals to people who were prepared to "GO" with love and service like Christ. RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me so I send you". (In 20:21)

This week we celebrated Pentecost Sunday, a very special day for Christians. We honor this day with great solemnity and festivity. This event concludes the season of Easter and marks the beginning of the Church. We celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem.

The biblical witnesses show us that the most robust hope emerges out of times of traumatic suffering. The Acts of the Apostles and John's Gospel are a good example of a biblical witness when the Spirit came amidst painful reality. The story of Pentecost in both readings pictures the Spirit animating the disciples who have been "cocooning" behind closed doors in the Upper Room, empowering them not only to talk in a variety of languages, but also to continue the vocation of Jesus in increasingly wider fields of ministry. Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me so I send you. (Jn 20:21).

Just as Jesus' words "Peace be with you" must have given the disciples much comfort and solace that eventful day in the Upper Room, these are words that should comfort us during days of trial and uncertainty. Fear is all-perversive in our world and in our lives. Despite this, the Day of Pentecost calls us to imagine what accepting this outpouring of the Holy Spirit might look like in our lives today. If we allow ourselves to imagine something new, something fresh, something holy, then anything is possible.

How then can we best serve as Christ's disciples, witnesses to the Gospel message when a new outflow of heavenly fire will give us the courage, language and power that we need to make our society and the world in which we live what our faith and love envision?

In answer to this question, we are called to be peacemakers, to aid in conflict-resolution between people and groups that harbour resentments and ill-will towards one another in our polarized society. We are called to fight against injustice and oppression, to act to bring positive change to systems that are discriminatory and which prevent people from being all that they can be in life. We are called to love and forgive others, working in ways that raise each other up and bring about the joy that is inherent in our salvation.

This is a tall order and our calling on Pentecost Day!

Thank God for the gift of the Spirit.



Download Bethany's Skoolbag App

Make sure you are kept in the loop with upcoming alerts, information and avents at Betharry.

DOWNLOAD BETHANY'S SKOOLBAG APP STRAIGHT TO YOUR SMARTPHONE OR TABLET DEVICE

Following these instructions:

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".
- 4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will than be visible, click "Free" then "install".
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, than "Setus"
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Coogle Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your achool name, using augure name will help.
- Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (clease note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- Click "Open" when Installed.
- 7. Click the "Mure" button on the bottom right of the App. then "Setup".


Our school will appear in "Nearby Locations' if you're within 10kms of the school, or search for our school by name.



School Permission Notes:

We wish to advise you that we are changing the way that permission notes are delivered to you.

School permission notes such as excursion notes will be distributed to families in a digital form on **Skoolbag**. An **eform** link will be attached to the skoolbag notification allowing parents/carers to complete and return it to the school automatically.

In order to access the **eform** through the **Skoolbag** app we are asking all parents/carers to make sure that they are subscribed to their **child's current grade**. This can be done by following the step-by-step instructions listed below.

Instructions to subscribe Skoolbag to a specific grade/grades:

- 1. Select "Groups"
- 2. Click "Edit Subscription Groups"
- 3. Select the grade or grades for which you would like to receive notifications

NB: If you are unable to access the **Skoolbag app**, but receive notifications through email, notes will be attached for you to print and once completed it can be returned to your child's teacher via your child.


