## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



Dear Bethany Families,

Last Sunday's reading from the Gospel of Luke focuses on a tax collector, this time a vertically challenged one called **Zaccheus**.

In the reading, **Zaccheus** climbs a sycamore tree in order to catch a view of **Jesus** as he is passing through the adoring crowds. Noticing Zaccheus up the tree, Jesus calls him **by name** then publicly declares that he will stay at his house that evening to break bread with him.

The scripture reading always reminds me of when I was teaching in another school during the mid 1990s. One day, during a whole school Mass, I looked up through the glass skylight in the church and noticed that there was a young man perched in the branch of a tree that overhung the church. Unfortunately, we subsequently realised that the young man, unlike Zaccheus, was not there to catch a glimpse of our Mass but was there to act as lookout whilst his mates were breaking into the school!

By highlighting Zaccheus without judgment and then inviting himself to his house, Jesus showed his **love** and **acceptance** of someone who was especially despised in that community. As a chief tax collector, working against his own people in support of the Roman occupying forces, Zaccheus was regarded very much as a **traitor**.

In turn, by **"going out on a limb"** to seek Christ, Zacchaeus showed he was willing to make a significant change in his life. He committed to help restore the harm he had caused by offering half of his belongings to the poor and paying back four times as much to anyone he had cheated.

Jesus' actions in this instance showed that instead of accusing Zaccheus, Jesus stood in **solidarity** and **compassion** with him and that **healing** and **forgiveness** was not reserved solely for the **'respectable'** ones but for all who were willing to **change** and strive to do better.

# ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



Dear Parents & Carers,

There is so much wonderful learning happening each and every day at Bethany! I thought I'd share some writing samples which our Year 6 students have worked really hard on. During Weeks 9 and 10 of Term 3 and Weeks 1 and 2 of Term 4, all Year 6 students participated in a Writer's Festival. The students engaged in workshops where they explored different elements and techniques to use in their writing. A number of different stimulus pictures were provided for the children to choose from to write an entertaining short story. Mentor texts written by well known authors including Roald Dahl, Morris Gleitzman and JK Rowling were used as exemplars. Figurative language, speech, topic sentences and adjectival phrases were some of the main focus areas.

The grade then co-constructed a Success Criteria so students would know what they had to do and what they had to include in their writing to be successful. Students referred back to this Success Criteria like a checklist to keep them on track.

During the writing process feedback and feedforward was provided by peers and teachers.

At the start of each lesson students presented their stories to the class as a work in progress and their ideas helped to influence and improve each other's work.

Students were able to choose how they would like to publish their finished pieces. Some students chose to make them into a book, there were some handwritten and typed pieces. Some students even included beautifully detailed illustrations.

The students from Year 5 and their teachers were invited to read the published stories and celebrate with Year 6. This also inspired the Year 5 students with ideas for their own writing.

I am delighted and so proud to share some short samples of writing below:

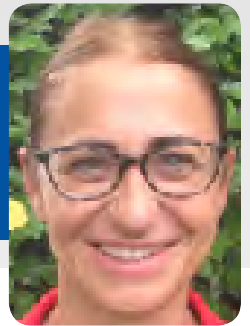

#### Expression of Interest registration window open

Dear Parents:

Parramatta Diocesan Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2023 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term 4 in 2022, Term 1 & 2 in 2023.

*Students in Year 4 in 2023 MAY nominate for the sports of Basketball, Hockey, Softball, Tennis & Touch Football only.*

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those students that **MUST** demonstrate an **ABOVE AVERAGE** ability. **HIGH LEVEL OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT** or in particular sports demonstrate **REPRESENTATIVE** playing experience in their nominated sport. In most sports, students should have experience playing regular competition outside of school.

To facilitate this, Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in some sports and others are through CSNSW Sport at MacKillop level and nominations will be available through the CSNSW Sport portal in 2023.

To be eligible for selection for these trials the **2023 CEDP Primary Sport TEAM Registration Form** must be completed. The registration form must be completed that can be accessed via the **PARRAMATTA DIOCESE PRIMARY SPORT WEBSITE** [www.parramattapara.catholic.edu.au](http://www.parramattapara.catholic.edu.au) OR scan the QR code below.

#### PARRAMATTA DIOCESE PRIMARY SPORT WEBSITE

Go to the "NEW SELECTIONS" tab and scroll down to the SPORT you wish to register for and click on the "REGISTER" button below the heading "Primary Sport Expression of Interest Registration Form".

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EOI)** for the 2023 Parramatta Diocese Primary Sport Team Trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per student, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

#### PARRAMATTA DIOCESE PRIMARY SPORT QR CODE

Click on the link to nominate your expression of interest.



#### APPROVALS PROCESS

This online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST** be approved by the student's school. For the student to attend the nominated trial or event, the school approves students based on playing history and selection criteria. All fields and especially "Representative Experience" if applicable to the sport **MUST** be completed. Under no circumstances will a student be eligible to trial if the 2023 CEDP Primary Sport TEAM Registration form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

#### PARRAMATTA TRIALS INFORMATION

Students that are **approved to attend** will receive a Primary Sport Team Sports Trial Information sheet and will be required to complete a consent form for the trials.

For **APPROVED** students, there is a team trial cost involved with the trials and **payment is to be made prior to attendance at 2023 trials and NOT at the trials**.

**FULL DAY TRIALS** - Tennis, Cricket & Boys Soccer

**HALF-DAY TRIALS** - AFL, Basketball, Girls Football, Netball, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Touch

**AFTERNOON SCHOOL TRIALS** - Hockey & Softball are held after school beginning at 4pm

Due to the popularity of boys' cricket, boys' soccer, and netball a maximum of two students are eligible to trial from each school. Selection of these students will be made jointly by the school sports coordinator and principal. Consideration can be sought from the CEDP Teaching Educator Primary Sport.

- The teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" - not a coach
- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and **must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.**
- Students need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.

### 2023 Parramatta Diocese Team Sport Trials Expression of Interest registration window open

#### **MACKILLOP TRIAL**

Mackillop Trials include students from Canberra/Goulburn, Parramatta, Sydney, Wagga Wagga & Wollongong Dioceses. The main purpose of the Mackillop trials is to select a team to compete at the NSWPSA Championships. The inter-Diocesan Mackillop Trials is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure. Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for students representing Parramatta at the Inter-Diocesan Mackillop Trials. This may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.

#### **NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Students who are successful at being selected for the Mackillop team will compete at the NSWPSA Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Students selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships, a State team will be selected to participate in the School Sport Australia Inter-State Exchange for some sports. Note that in Rugby League U11 Year, there is no state team selected.

#### **SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA**

To be considered for selection in the NSWPSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & under championships, students must be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition (i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSA State selection).

# ATTENDANCE

Regular and punctual attendance at school is essential to assist children to maximise their potential. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.

The school day commences at 8:30am at Bethany. The morning music commences at 8:27am and concludes with the bell, where by this time, students have walked to class and are entering their classrooms.

Please note that gates will be closed at 8:30am with the bell. Staff on duty have classes, meetings and professional learning to attend to at this time. As such, the gates must be closed on time, as teachers have a duty of care to the students in their class and other responsibilities to attend to.

Similarly, the learning commences in all classrooms at 8:30am. Missing any part of the morning can mean that prayer has been missed, instructions have not been heard and routines have not been set in motion. As a consequence, students can find themselves disorientated and taking longer to settle into their learning.

Please ensure that students are on time at school every day and take into consideration the fact that the carpark does begin to get busy from 8:20am. Should unforeseen circumstances prevent you from arriving on time, please ensure that children are signed in at the office by an adult.

Where possible, parents are encouraged to make appointments outside of school hours, as all late arrivals and early departures are recorded as partial absences.

It is important that everyone works together to help children obtain the best possible start in life with a good education. It is vital that both school and parents encourage regular and punctual attendance at school.
