PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Bethany Families,

Last Sunday we celebrated the feast of **The Most Holy Trinity**.

For centuries, artists have used iconography to convey complex theology through picture and colour. This is indeed the case when we look at the artist Rublev's icon called the *Oak at Mamre*. This beautiful icon shows us the **Trinity** depicted as three angels seated around a table under an oak tree in front of Abraham's house.







In the icon we see the **Father, Son** & **Holy Spirit** as three angels each wearing different coloured garments showing that each person of the Trinity is distinct.

The **first angel** on the left wears a blue undergarment and a purple outer garment symbolizing the divine and regal nature of God.

The **second angel** is wearing the clothes typically worn by Jesus - crimson symbolising His humanity and blue His divinity.

The **third angel** is wearing a blue garment also meaning divinity, as well as a green vestment over the top. The green represents the Holy Spirit's renewing power as well as the liturgical colour worn on Pentecost in the Orthodox Church.

The **two angels** on the right of the icon have a slightly bowed head toward the other, illustrating the fact that the Son and Spirit come from the Father.

In the **center of the icon** is a table that resembles an altar reminding us of the sacrament of the Eucharist and of the Trinity's abundant **hospitality**.

Rublev's icon gives us a **glimpse without words** of the mystery of the Trinity depicted through the interrelationship of three angels seated around a set table and inviting us to be part of the scene.

SEMESTER 1 HALF YEARLY REPORTS

Over the last week I have had the privilege of reading some of the student's Semester One Reports. As I read about the student's achievements and areas which they are working on I always pay particular attention to their 'Effort in Learning' rating as well as their 'Learner Qualities'.

Many scholars and educational leaders often talk about the future for our students and the education that we are providing in order for us to prepare them for their future. Many of the jobs that our students will most likely be engaging in, have not even been invented yet. There's no way to prepare students for specific careers when we can't even fathom what those might be.

While teachers understand that content is necessary in giving learning a context, they acknowledge that with the continual 'information explosion' it is no longer possible for anyone to know all the information about the world which was once possible and expected by students of the past.

"The most important skill is a meta-skill: the ability to adapt to changes," says Calton Pu, professor at the Georgia Institute of Technology. "As the rate of technological innovation intensifies, the workforce of the future will need to adapt to new technology and new markets. The people who can adapt the best (and fastest) will win."

This means students will need to become lifelong learners, and it's up to educators to ignite their curiosity while teaching them to explore the crossroads between different subjects and disciplines.

The focus has shifted. Learners are required to do more than 'know' but rather are required to think and to do this in conjunction with other thinkers. They are required to be **adaptable**, **flexible**, **creative**, **problem solvers**, **inventors**, **ask questions**, **manage and give feedback** and more importantly **manage change**; to **learn**, **unlearn** and **relearn**. Children are required to **work cooperatively**, to **organise** and **pace** their assignments, **work independently** and **keep on task**.

When you read your child's report on Friday 1st July, I encourage you to look out for these skills and discuss their importance with your children. Celebrate their achievements within the content taught but also their efforts and skills and habits when engaging in the learning process.
