Dear Bethany Families,

On Wednesday we gathered as a school to re-enact, pray and meditate on Christ's joyful entry into Jerusalem on **Palm Sunday** which the Church will celebrate this coming Sunday.

In their classes our students have engaged in special liturgies as part of their studies in Religious Education to mark the **Holy Week** events of the **Last Supper** and the **Crucifixion**.

At the heart of our faith are the events of Christ's ministry – **His life, death, and resurrection**. During this time of the year we are led to contemplate once again that Jesus was both a person and at the same time Divine.

As a community of faith we walk with Christ and one another through the triumphant entry into Jerusalem on **Palm Sunday** and the **Last Supper** to the bitter agony of the **Crucifixion** on the cross and to the empty tomb and the joyful resurrection of **Easter Sunday**.

We walk not in great strides during this time but in small steps, passing through each movement mindful that we will reach the **Resurrection** and that just like Christ our own lives will be forever transformed by the journey.

Why do the events of Holy Week and Easter resonate so strongly within us?

Perhaps it is because we can personally relate with the **humanity** of Christ's own experience. In our personal struggles, grief, doubts, missteps, losses and disappointments we, in essence, share in **Christ's Passion**.

The great promise of Easter is that after darkness, suffering and loss - life & love will prevail.

May each of your families be graced with a holy, safe and blessed Easter and may the Risen Christ reign in your homes.


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Term 1 has been such a busy term. Below are some samples of student work from Kindergarten through to Year 6.




Kindergarten have been learning about the events of Holy Week. This drawing from Brianna in Kindergarten represents the Last Supper.

Year 3 learning in Religious Education this term has been all about the Sacraments. This work sample reviews how we, as sacramental people, can choose to follow Jesus.



The Religious education Learning Cycle in **Year 4** this term has been about

building a covenant relationship with God. Mia's work outlines ways that we can connect with God and how we refer to God in different contexts.

The overarching question for the learning cycle that Year 5 have been investigating is about Jesus reveals God to us. This sample of student work demonstrates how God is revealed to us through the seven sacraments.

Education lessons has focused on how to be responsible and look after the world that God created for us. This work sample shows the difference between what our world looks like when we look after it

and what it looks like when we don't look after it.

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Year 6 have been learning about ways that God offers hope for our world. The gifts of the Holy Spirit as outlined in this sample of Year 6 work is one way that God offers us hope.

On Wednesday, our Bethany community celebrated the first of the events of Holy Week - Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday is the day we recall Jesus' entry into Jerusalem after he had been travelling and teaching in the areas around Jerusalem. Upon his entry into the city, Jesus was welcomed like a king, even though unlike any other king, he was riding on a donkey. The people waved palm branches in the air and placed their cloaks and branches on the ground in front him.

The events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday have been celebrated in classrooms with students in the form of class prayer liturgies.

ATTENDANCE

Regular and punctual attendance at school is essential to assist children to maximise their potential. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.

The school day commences at 8:30am at Bethany. The morning music commences at 8:27am and concludes with the bell, where by this time, students have walked to class and are entering their classrooms.

Please note that gates will be closed at 8:30am with the bell. Staff on duty have classes, meetings and professional learning to attend to at this time. As such, the gates must be closed on time, as teachers have a duty of care to the students in their class and other responsibilities to attend to.

Similarly, the learning commences in all classrooms at 8:30am. Missing any part of the morning can mean that prayer has been missed, instructions have not been heard and routines have not been set in motion. As a consequence, students can find themselves disorientated and taking longer to settle into their learning.

Please ensure that students are on time at school every day and take into consideration the fact that the carpark does begin to get busy from 8:20am. Should unforeseen circumstances prevent you from arriving on time, please ensure that children are signed in at the office by an adult.

Where possible, parents are encouraged to make appointments outside of school hours, as all late arrivals and early departures are recorded as partial absences.

It is important that everyone works together to help children obtain the best possible start in life with a good education. It is vital that both school and parents encourage regular and punctual attendance at school.
