PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Bethany Families,

Recently our Year 6 students, together with their teachers and several staff, travelled to Canberra. This excursion is important in helping children develop an understanding of the Australian democratic system, civics, history, and our cultural identity. The time away is also memorable on a relational level for children in their final year of primary school.

The students who attended the excursion this year were fine representatives of our school community. The feedback they received regarding their conduct from the staff at various venues such as Parliament House, The Australian War Memorial, The National Arboretum, Old Parliament House, The National Botanical Garden, Questacon and Cockington Green was consistently positive and affirming.

One of the undoubted highlights of their time in Canberra was the visit to the Australian War Memorial. As you would know the Memorial includes the Roll of Honour which names the individual 102,000 men and women who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our country. One of these names included **Private Jim Martin** - the youngest soldier listed on the Roll of Honour.

Jim Martin's story is incredibly inspirational and tragic. At the beginning of WWI Jim who was just 3 months past his 14th birthday and wished desperately to enlist. His parents initially refused his request, so he threatened to run away and join the Australian Army under a fake name. Seeing how desperate her son was to serve his country his mother reluctantly agreed - and falsely told authorities he was 18 years old.

Jim Martin was firstly deployed to Egypt and later was sent to Gallipoli. At Gallipoli his landing vessel was struck by a torpedo offshore. He spent several hours in the water until he was rescued and finally went ashore on September 7, 1915 - surviving the initial landing at Gallipoli he was able to dig in.

Unfortunately, Jim contracted typhoid and died two months after the landing in the disease-ridden trenches on the foothills of ANZAC Cove. He was later buried at sea - his mother back in Australia was forever affected by her decision to allow him to enlist.

Jim was only a year or two older than the children who attended the excursion last week. His story is one of thousands that are contained and honoured in the War Memorial. It reminds us that the privileges and freedoms we all enjoy today were achieved through the brave and selfless service of ordinary people who acted extraordinarily in the most trying conditions on our behalf.

Finally, I wish to thank and acknowledge the Bethany staff who planned, supported, and supervised our students on the excursion to Canberra this year. The responsibility and demands for staff in taking students away on an overnight excursion are significant and we appreciate their service and care immensely.






Why we should love the Virgin Mary -

YEAR 6 CAMP

Our Year 6 students from Bethany have recently undertaken an education tour of our National Capital. They were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The students visited Old and New Parliament House, The National Museum of Democracy, War Memorial, Cockington Green Gardens, The National Arboretum, The Australian National Botanic Gardens, and Questacon. They were able to participate in hands-on experiences that helped deepen their knowledge of Australia's History. This was in line with our Project Based Learning unit, Australia as a Nation. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
