Dear Parents and Carers.

Welcome back to another wonderful year of learning at Bethany. We also welcome all the new students and families who have started their educational journey at Bethany this year along with all the new Kindergarten students and their families.

I hope you all had a relaxing holiday with your family and found the time to enjoy the things you love the most.

As we begin the 2023 school year there are just a few friendly reminders about attendance and online safety I'd like to share with you.

#### **Attendance**

Please send your child/children to school on time each day. Regular attendance at school is essential for a smooth start to the day and academic progress. Students should be at school by the bell at 8:30am for the commencement of the school day. The school gates are closed very shortly after the bell and any students arriving after 8:30am need to be taken to the office by a parent who is required to sign them in and obtain a late note.

It is very important that children remain at school for the entire day. The bell for afternoon dismissal goes at 2.45pm. Any child who is required to leave school early for illness, an appointment, etc. must be signed out in the office by a parent and a partial absence will be recorded.

#### LEARNING IN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Term One has started with such enthusiasm! The smiling faces say it all.

Each grade has begun their Learning Cycle in Religious Education for Term One. The following is an overview of the Focus Question that each grade will base their learning on in Religious Education:

**Kindergarten** - How is Jesus A Friend Who Loves Us?

**Year One** - How am I a unique person who is loved by God?

**Year Two** - How can we as God's children care for the world?

**Year Three** - How does belonging strengthen our relationship with others?

Year Four - Who is God?

**Year Five** - How is God revealed to us through Jesus?

**Year Six** - In which ways does God offer us hope for our world?



#### **BETHANY RE ANGELS**

Students at Bethany are always encouraged to be active in their faith. One way that we can support this is through the role of a Bethany RE Angel.

RE Angels are students in Years 3-6 who can assist in the preparation and presentation of liturgies and social justice events.

One RE Angel is selected per primary class (i.e. in grades 3 - 6). Next week (Week 4), the students will be informed of the opportunity to apply to be an RE Angel. Below is a list of qualities that an RE Angel would ideally model:

- care: <u>offering support to others</u> who they see might be struggling.
- **respect**: accepting that other people have different opinions, talents and abilities.
- **proud to be a Bethany student**: someone who <u>strives to live out the</u> <u>school motto</u>: **In Christ we love and Serve.**
- following Jesus' example by being respectful of the <u>faith beliefs and experiences of others</u>
- honesty
- **prayerful:** understand that <u>praying is an important part of daily life</u> at Bethany.
- **reverent**: during *liturgies, Masses and prayer times.*

Students who are interested in becoming an RE Angel will be invited to write an expression of interest explaining how they display the above qualities. All expressions of interest are due





# **ATTENDANCE**

CEDP promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education.

If your child is sick or absent you are required to notify their school on the first day of absence if at all possible. All explanations to the school must be provided within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence.

Absences can be explained using one of the following methods:

- 1. SMS: click on the link that will be sent to parents via SMS if their child is absent
- 2. Email the school at bethany@parra.catholic.edu.au
- 3. Telephone the school office on 4723 3700
- 4. Note sent with your child

Where an explanation has not been received within the 7 day timeframe or the explanation has not been accepted, the school will record the absence as unexplained or unjustified on the student's record. The school will not be able to accept explanations which are not received within the 7 day timeframe.

Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- · being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

#### Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Parents of children aged 6 to 17 years are legally required to ensure their children attend school every day or provide an explanation if they are absent. Notifying the school and providing an explanation for your child's absence will fulfil this legal responsibility.

The safety and wellbeing of students are the highest priorities for schools. Parents need to know if their child isn't at school, and schools need to know when and why a child is absent. Notifying the school of your child's absence helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of all children in school.

#### What is your responsibility?

- Ensure your child attends school every day
- Notify the school immediately if your child is absent
- Provide an explanation for any absences within 7 days
- Make sure the school has your correct contact details so that you can receive attendance information about your child.



# OTHER MATTERS

#### SKOOLBAG, OKR APPS & MUNCH MONITOR ONLINE ACCOUNT

Please update your child's year level in the Skoolbag and QKR apps. This will ensure that all communication from the school is received and payments made correctly. The canteen has also asked that parents visit the Munch Monitor website to update their child's class for this year. Thank you.

#### REMINDER

To minimise interruption to important learning time, please check that your child/children have packed recess, a drink bottle, lunch and the books that are required for their school day before they leave home.

#### AFTERNOON DISMISSAL

Please ensure that the school has the correct afternoon dismissal information for your child. If you need to make a change to the dismissal arrangements for your child due to unforeseen circumstances please notify the School office by 2:00pm.


