#### **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**





Dear Bethany Families,

It is hard to believe but we are already at the halfway point of the term. We concluded last week on a really high note with our **Opening School Mass** and **Welcome BBQ**.

Our **Opening School Mass** last Friday was both beautiful, meaningful and well attended by parents and families. Thank you to our Parish Priest, Father Suresh for his spiritual nourishment and leadership and also to our Religious Education Coordinator, Catherine Baldacchino for planning and preparing the children to participate in this first Eucharist of the school year.

On Friday evening we hosted a **Welcome BBQ.** It was a relaxed, convivial and really well-attended event. Thank you to all those who volunteered to help in various ways to plan, cook and serve the BBQ.

Yesterday we began the season of **Lent** by being marked on our foreheads with the ashes burnt from last year's palms. The season of Lent which begins on **Ash Wednesday** is always 46 days (40 days and 6 Sundays) before Easter Sunday.

The number **40** traditionally symbolises a period of **testing**, **trial** or **probation** and has important biblical significance:

- Jesus stayed in the desert for **40** days before commencing his ministry
- Jesus stayed with his disciples for **40** days after His resurrection before ascending into Heaven.
- Jerusalem was destroyed **40** years after the crucifixion of Christ
- Moses lived for **40** years in Egypt and **40** years in the desert before entering the Promised Land with the chosen people
- Moses stayed on Mt Sinai for **40** days and nights
- The prophet Elijah took **40** days to reach Mt Sinai
- The number 40 also represents a generation of human life
- The number **40** is traditionally attributed to the Christian virtue of humility

The season of **Lent** leading to **Holy Week** & **Easter** provides us with a time to deepen our spiritual relationship with God and to translate this into action through **fasting** (giving up), **almsgiving** (giving to others) & **prayer**. In doing so we are led to step out of our comfort zone and become more humble and charitable and in service to others.

Wishing everyone a blessed first week of Lent.



# ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



Dear Parents and Carers,

It was so lovely to meet and have time to have a chat with many of our new families at the Welcome BBQ last week. We look forward to welcoming you to a number of other school events this year.

#### **NAPLAN 2023**

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Each year students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

From 2023, NAPLAN is moving to Term 1 and will take place from **Wednesday 15 March** to **Monday 27 March**. The reason for this change is so that results can be returned to schools earlier in the year which will support teachers to understand the learning needs of their students and plan accordingly.

NAPLAN tests are just one part of our school learning assessment program and questions are primarily based on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year of schooling.

In preparation for NAPLAN 2023, our school will undertake activities to help students to become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. These activities are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked.

Students and parents can access the <u>public demonstration site</u> (<a href="https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site">https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site</a>) to familiarise themselves with NAPLAN and the types of questions and tools available. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not required nor recommended.

If you have any questions about NAPLAN, please contact your child's teacher.

#### **NAPLAN CHANGES FROM 2023**

Beginning this year there will also be changes to the way that NAPLAN results are reported. Parents and carers will get earlier and simpler information about their child's NAPLAN achievement based on the following 4 levels of achievement:

- Exceeding
- Strong
- Developing
- Needs additional support.

The descriptors for each category will make it clear to parents what their child's literacy and numeracy skills are at the time of NAPLAN testing, and we will continue to work with you to meet your child's needs. NAPLAN will remain one of many useful ways that we assess your child's learning and support needs.

### ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE CONT'D

#### **EARLY PICK UP OF STUDENTS**

If your child/children need to be picked up early from school and you are unable to do so, we ask that the office be notified by email prior to the pickup time with the following information:

- Full name of child
- Class
- Name of the person collecting your child
- Time of pick up

Please ensure that the person picking up your child/children have ID for the office staff to verify. Please note: This is regardless of whether the nominated person is listed as an emergency contact.

### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**



This week we celebrated **ASH WEDNESDAY** with the St Padre Pio Parish community. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the 40 days of Lent. Lent is the preparation period before Easter which is the most significant feast day within the Church's liturgical year.

Forty is an important number in the Bible.

In the Old Testament, scripture tells us that Moses waited for forty days and nights before he could go to Mount Sinai to receive the Ten Commandments. Moses prepared himself for this event during this time.

The Israelites walked through the desert for forty years before they could enter the promised land. This period was a time of learning to obey God's Commandments, thus a preparation for beginning a new life in the Holy Land.

Elijah the prophet, walked for forty days to meet God on Mount Sinai. Like Moses, Elijah used this time to prepare himself to meet God.

In the New Testament we hear how Jesus spent forty days and nights in the desert to prepare himself before he could begin God's work.

We can clearly see that the forty day/ night/ year period has been used by biblical people as a time of preparation.

As Catholics, we too are called to use this forty day period in Lent to prepare ourselves for Jesus' Resurrection.





We prepare through our actions: we reject sinful ways and repent, we fast on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and other Fridays during Lent by not eating meat, and we reach out to others in need.

We prepare through spiritual connections with God: through prayer and the renewal of promises made at our Baptism.

Each classroom at Bethany has been issued a Project Compassion box. This initiative from Caritas Australia is a way that our community can reach out to others who are most in need and will complement the learning that our students engage in during their

Religious Education lessons. Coin donations are gratefully accepted for Project Compassion.

#### **WORLD YOUTH DAY 2023**

This year WYD takes place in Lisbon, Portugal. Each school within the Diocese of Parramatta is participating in fundraising to support the youth of the diocese to attend this spiritual pilgrimage. At Bethany, this fundraiser will take place on Friday 10th March with a mufti day. Donations will be made via QKR which will be open from Thursday 9th March.



#### **Story Box Library**

If your family has joined our Bethany Community this year, you may not yet be aware that our school has a subscription to **Story Box Library.** This enables all students and their families to access Australian literature read by Australian authors, illustrators and storytellers. It is a safe online space free from advertising.



**Story Box Library** does not replace the important experience of

borrowing books from our school library and reading each night at home. Story Box Library supplements children's reading experiences by connecting them with literature through the complementary medium of film and allowing them to read and listen to books that may not be available in our school library.

**Story Box Library** regularly adds new books, so is an ever-growing library aimed at Kindergarten to Year 6 students. The wide selection of books can be searched by themes, length and appropriateness for different age groups.


