PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE





LAETARE

SUNDAY

Dear Bethany Families,

Welcome to **Week 9** and the halfway mark of the season of **Lent.** Our Catholic tradition is rich in symbolism and ritual but often we are unaware of the origins of certain traditions as they have emerged from another time and culture.

Last Sunday was the Fourth Sunday in Lent which is also known as *Laetare Sunday*.

The word *Laetare* in Latin means *to rejoice* with hope. To emphasize this theme of rejoicing, the liturgical colour the Mass of the day temporarily changes from the sombre **purple** to a **rose** colour.

The colour rose is only worn on two Sundays during the year - on Laetare

Sunday and again halfway through Advent on *Gaudete Sunday* - a day also focussed on joyful anticipation as we get closer to the birth of Jesus at Christmas.

Music for the Mass on *Laetare Sunday* is brighter in tone with the first word sung in the entrance antiphon being "Rejoice". The altar also changes from its minimalist look to include decorations of bright flowers such as roses to reflect the joyfulness of the day.

So why are we rejoicing in the midst of the fasting, penance, almsgiving and austerity of Lent?



In a nutshell the Church is encouraging its faithful to stay awake and remain hope-filled because the joy of Easter and the Risen Christ is just around the corner. It also serves as a small break from the sombreness of the Lenten season.

The Gospel reading of the day focuses on Christ's power to heal by recounting the story of the blindman whose sight was restored by Christ. Through the themes and readings of the day the Church is inviting us to think beyond the darkness and sadness of Calvary to the light and joy of the Pasqual Mystery that we will celebrate on Easter Sunday.

At Bethany Catholic Primary School, Jesus is at the centre of all that we do each and every day. Easter is the greatest celebration in the Catholic church because it is the completion of Holy Week that ends with the resurrection of Jesus. Easter celebrates the beginning and foundation of Christianity. Jesus was raised from the dead! Easter is a reminder for us that Jesus has overcome death and sin. His resurrection marks the triumph of good over evil, sin and death. It is the singular event which proves that those who trust in God and accept Christ will be raised from the dead. Since Easter represents the fulfillment of God's promises to mankind, it is the most important holiday on the Christian calendar.



Our design represents the final station of the cross. This is a pinnacle point of the bible where we remember all that Jesus did

for us. The use of the colour purple represents the liturgical season of Lent. The image of the three crosses represents the final place where Jesus was nailed to the cross with the words "He has risen" displayed at the bottom.

Each school's egg will be displayed in the shopping centre and customers will have the opportunity to vote for their favourite School Egg through a QR code.

STUDENT ARRIVAL, DISMISSAL, SUPERVISION & PICK UP PROCEDURES

School Times:

Morning Supervision begins at 8:00 am and concludes at 8:30 am

School starts 8:30 am and concludes at 2:45 pm

Afternoon Supervision begins at 2:45 pm and concludes at 3:15 pm

ARRIVAL

Students arrive via one of three access points:

Gate 1: William Howell Dr (students who walk, are dropped by bus or dropped by car on William Howell Dr)

Gate 2: Beside the Canteen/Hall (Kiss & Drop or parents walking their children in) opens at 8am

Gate 3: Caroline Chisholm Catholic College

Students arriving prior to 8:00 am to gather outside Gate 1 (in front of the administration office) and sit quietly.

Gates 1 and 2 and/or 4 are opened at 8:00 am by the teacher on duty.

Gate 3 is closed between the hours of 8:35 - 2:40 pm (Duty Teacher to unlock)

All gates will be locked between the following hours: - 3.15 pm - 8:00 am, 8:35 am - 2:40 pm

- 1. All children are expected to arrive at school between 8:00 am and 8:25 am
- 2. Students to enter in the morning via gates 1, 2 (and/or 4) & 3.
- 3. Once on site, all students are to independently place their bags on hooks outside their classroom and move to passive play areas.

Student only zones are:

- * Year 1 Year 2 bag area.
- * Kindergarten and Years 3 6 pavers
- * Basketball courts
- * Astro Turf
- 5. Music will play at 8:28 am prior to the bell, indicating that learning is about to commence.
- 6. Students proceed to their class lines.
- 7. Teachers are expected to be at lines before the music stops playing.
- 8. Gates 2 and 4 will be locked at 8:30 am by teacher on *Kiss and Drop* Duty/Basketball Court duty/ teacher on Gate 2/4 entry duty.

STUDENT ARRIVAL, DISMISSAL, SUPERVISION & PICK UP PROCEDURES CONT'D

LATE ARRIVALS:

- Students who arrive after the gates are locked at 8:30am are to be signed in by their parent/carer at the school office. Parents are required to complete a "late arrival / early departure" pink slip and the student receives a late pass to take back to their teacher.
- Late arrivals are recorded (as partial absences) in Compass by the office staff.

DISMISSAL

- The following gates to be opened at 2:45 pm (designated person)
 - Gate 1: Teacher on bus duty
 - Gate 3: Teacher on gate duty
 - Gate 4: Kiss and Ride teacher on Afternoon Duty
 - Gate 5: Teacher on duty
- The modes of dismissal are:
 - · Parent pickup parents/carers enter the school via Gate 5 (Welcome Garden gate) and pick their children up front the basketball courts.
 - · Kiss and Ride students walk to Gate 4 and line up outside Year 1 classes.
 - · Bus students wait at the basketball courts until the teachers on bus duty arrive to walk them to Gate 1; students wait outside the school office until their bus arrives.
 - · Walkers students wait at the basketball courts until the teacher on Walker's duty arrives to walk them across William Howell Drive via the demountable gate. **Students do not wait for a parent to collect them from this area, as this is not a supervised pick-up point.**
 - · COSHC students wait at the basketball courts until COSHC staff member arrives to walk them to the hall.

Students exit via one of three access points:

- Gate 1: William Howell Drive (Students who catch a bus)
- Gate 3: Caroline Chisholm
- Gate 4: Opens at 2:45 pm for student dismissal for Park & Collect.
- Gate 5: Access and exit point for parents walking with their children to the car park or walking home. Students can only access this gate if accompanied by a supervising adult.
- Parents/carers to enter via Gate 5 and proceed to the basketball court.
- All students must be wearing their hats.
- All teachers should be wearing their High Visibility Vests.
- Teachers on afternoon duties proceed to designated waiting areas ie Bus, Walkers, Kiss and Ride, Parent Pick-up Basketball Court, Welcome Garden Gate and Caroline Chisholm gate.
- When all students have arrived at their dismissal areas, the teachers on duty begin dismissing students from their area. Students on the basketball court being collected by an adult remain under the supervision of the teacher on duty upon dismissal. Any student not collected by 3:15 pm from the basketball court is to be accompanied to the office.

Bus designated area - Students wait for buses on the paved area between the Welcome Garden and the student foyer. Students **sit** behind cones displaying bus numbers.

STUDENT ARRIVAL, DISMISSAL, SUPERVISION & PICK UP PROCEDURES CONT'D

Walkers - Students line up on the basketball court and wait for teacher instruction to begin moving to their designated area across the road.

Kiss and Ride - Students sit on the ground between the 1 Blue classroom and the Learning Support demountable.

Parent Pick up - Basketball Court - Students sit in two lines on the basketball court behind their grade sign. The student will High 5 the teacher on duty before going to their parent.

ADJUSTMENTS

On the rare occasion that extreme weather conditions occur (strong winds, torrential rain, extreme heat), dismissal procedures may change. Parents and carers will be informed via the Bethany Skoolbag app in the form of an alert if this occurs.

BULLYING OF STUDENTS - PREVENTION AND RESPONSE PROCEDURES

Bethany Catholic Primary School as part of Catholic Schools Parramatta Diocese (CSPD) promotes positive relationships which reflect Gospel teachings and Catholic values. A core aspect of this work is in the prevention and response to incidents of bullying.

The school is guided by the principles outlined in *CSPD Bullying of Students - Prevention and Response Procedure (2022)*. This document guides schools, students, parents/carers to work together to create a safe and respectful learning community characterised by positive, respectful relationships. The document directs school communities on how to respond fairly, respectfully and sensitively to the needs of students.

The document outlines the difference between bullying as opposed to conflict, roles & responsibilities, prevention & response strategies and resources to support parents/carers.

ATTENDANCE

Regular and punctual attendance at school is essential to assist children to maximise their potential. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.

The school day commences at 8:30am at Bethany. The morning music commences at 8:27am and concludes with the bell, where by this time, students have walked to class and are entering their classrooms.

Please note that gates will be closed at 8:30am with the bell. Staff on duty have classes, meetings and professional learning to attend to at this time. As such, the gates must be closed on time, as teachers have a duty of care to the students in their class and other responsibilities to attend to.


Similarly, the learning commences in all classrooms at 8:30am. Missing any part of the morning can mean that prayer has been missed, instructions have not been heard and routines have not been set in motion. As a consequence, students can find themselves disorientated and taking longer to settle into their learning.

Please ensure that students are on time at school every day and take into consideration the fact that the carpark does begin to get busy from 8:20am. Should unforeseen circumstances prevent you from arriving on time, please ensure that children are signed in at the office by an adult.

Where possible, parents are encouraged to make appointments outside of school hours, as all late arrivals and early departures are recorded as partial absences.

It is important that everyone works together to help children obtain the best possible start in life with a good education. It is vital that both school and parents encourage regular and punctual attendance at school.
